Patricia StandTal Clarke has been teaching and practicing integrative wholistic medicine around the world for half a century. She received her bachelors from UC Berkeley, her medical degree at University of Minnesota, her Family Medicine fellowship at Dartmouth, and her DMin at Claremont School of Theology. She has served over four decades as an ordained Priest; 24 years as Medical Director of RedRoad Medicine; 23 years in private practice; 20 years with the United Nations; on faculty at two medical schools; as a principal investigator in Native Medicine, HIV, and diabetes research; and on numerous boards. She is a Fellow AAFP, a founding diplomat of ABHIM and ABoIM, an NIH honoree, "Changing the Face of Medicine," and a Didanawisgi (Native Healer), practicing integrative medicine of 1000 generations. Dr. Clarke's presentation is a discussion about Native folk's relationship with Plant People: history, nutrition, ceremony, toes in the soil, medicine.
